Prayer in this application under Rule 3-A (i) Chapter VI, Part-B, Volume V of the High Court Rules and Orders is for exemption to mention the roll of advocate number in the present petition.

For the reasons mentioned in the application, which is duly supported by an affidavit of the counsel, the same is allowed.

Exemption, as prayed for, is granted.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that the petitioner has been approaching the respondents highlighting the aspect of illegal construction having been carried out by respondents No.6 and 7 in the back portion of the house. Counsel contends that non-compoundable construction has been carried out but despite the complaint having been made by the petitioner, nothing has been done by the respondents. His assertion is that the latest representation dated 21.03.2023 (Annexure P-3), as has been submitted by the petitioner to the respondents has also not solicited any response. He, therefore, contends that the petitioner at this stage would be

satisfied if a direction is issued to respondents No.2 and 3 to consider and decide the same within some specified time.

In the light of the prayer made by the counsel for the petitioner, without going into the merits of the case or commenting thereon, we dispose of the present petition by directing the Chief Administrator, Haryana Shahari Vikas Pradhikaran, Panchkula-respondent No.2 and Estate Officer, HSVP, Karnal-respondent No.3 to consider the representation dated 21.03.2023 (Annexure P-3) of the petitioner within a period of four months from today by giving notice to the petitioner as well as respondents No.6 and 7 and on hearing them, proceed to pass appropriate orders in accordance with law.

In case the claim, as has been made by the petitioner is found to be correct, the consequential steps be also taken thereafter.
