The present petition has been filed under Section 482 Cr.P.C. for quashing of complaint COMI-54/2017 dated 17.08.2017 and the order dated 26.11.2018 summoning the petitioners under Sections 323, 324, 341 and 506 IPC and all subsequent proceedings arising out of it on the basis of a compromise deed dated 23.05.2021 (Annexure P-3).

On 22.07.2021 this Court had directed the parties to appear before the Illaqa Magistrate/Trial Cour for recording of their respective statements with regard to the compromise/settlement, who in turn was directed to submit a report along with the recorded statements with regard to the veracity of the compromise, if any, between the parties as also to apprise this Court if is there any other case pending against them and his/their status of being proclaimed offender/person.

As directed, report dated 14.09.2021 from the Judicial Magistrate, Ist Class, SAS Nagar, Mohali has been received, as per which the parties had recorded their statements before the Trial Court in terms of the compromise arrived at between them and none of the petitioners has been declared a proclaimed offender.

Learned State counsel has also raised no objection if the present petition is allowed.

In view of the above, continuation of the proceedings in pursuance of the afore-referred FIR in which the offences are not heinous and the matter having been compromised, would be an abuse of the process of law and in terms of the law laid down by the Supreme Court in **Narinder Singh vs. State of Punjab, (2014) 6 SCC 466**, this Court deems it just and proper to allow the petition and resultantly quash the complaint COMI-54/2017 dated 17.08.2017 and the order dated 26.11.2018 summoning the petitioners under Sections 323, 324, 341 and 506 IPC and all proceedings arising therefrom, qua the petitioners.
