AMAN CHAUDHARY. J.

1. On 10.05.2023, this Court had passed the following order:-

“The present petition has been filed under Section 438 Cr.P.C. for grant of pre-arrest bail to the petitioners in case of FIR No.0121 dated 19.04.2023, registered under Sections 452, 323, 341, 506, 148, 149 IPC at Police Station Dera Bassi, Tehsil Dera Bassi, District SAS Nagar (Mohali), Punjab.

Learned counsel contends that it is a case of version and cross-version, petitioner No.1 having submitted a representation dated 21.04.2023 to the police (Annexure P-2) alleging that the complainant party had beaten him and his grandson. However, no FIR has been lodged to that effect as of now. The petitioners and complainant party are even otherwise related to each other. As per the FIR, the alleged occurrence is said to have been taken place on the road, however, just to make the offences graver, Section 452 IPC has been added. No specific role has been attributed to the petitioners and the injuries allegedly suffered are simple in nature. They are not involved in any other case. The petitioners are ready and willing to join investigation as and when required by the investigating agency.

Notice of motion.

At the asking of the Court, Mr. Manipal Singh Atwal, DAG Punjab accepts notice on behalf of respondent-State.

Meanwhile, the petitioners are directed to join the investigation on or before 17.05.2023. In the event of their arrest, they shall be released on interim bail to the satisfaction of the Arresting Officer, subject to compliance of conditions as enshrined under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.

However, it is clarified that if the petitioners do not join and cooperate with the Investigating Agency as required by the

Arresting/Investigating Officer, this interim order shall be deemed to have been vacated.

Adjourned to 18.07.2023.”

2. Learned counsel submits that in pursuance of the afore-mentioned order, the petitioners have not only joined investigation but also fully cooperated with the investigating agency. He further submits that in case the investigating agency requires the petitioners to appear, they shall make themselves available without demur.
3. Learned State counsel on instructions affirms the factum of joining the investigation by the petitioners and cooperating with the investigating agency. He also submits that at this stage, the petitioners are not required for further custodial interrogation.
4. In view of the above and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, anticipatory bail petition filed by the petitioners is allowed and the order dated 10.05.2023 granting interim bail to them, is hereby made absolute, subject to compliance of conditions as specified under Section 438(2) Cr. P.C.
5. However, it is made clear that if the petitioners fail to join and cooperate with the investigating agency as and when required, the State would be at liberty to move an application for cancellation of the present anticipatory bail granted to them.
