1. By this common order, the above mentioned two writ petitions are being disposed of, as these petitions involve similar question of law. The facts are being taken from CWP-10141-2023.
2. In the present petition, the challenge is to the order dated 05.05.2023 (Annexure P-1) passed by respondent No.2, whereby preferences for transfer/posting were sought from the petitioners.
3. Learned counsel for the petitioners submits that the data which is being maintained by the respondents for considering the case of an employee for transfer is not upto date, which has led to inconsistencies

while effecting the transfers. Learned counsel submits that the said data should be corrected by the department so that, in future the petitioners do not suffer any prejudice due to any inaction on the part of the department. Learned counsel submits that the liberty be also given to the petitioners to approach the respondents in case, they can be accommodated at any nearby station keeping in view the provisions of the transfer policy, which the respondents themselves are adhering to.

4. Learned State counsel submits that in case the petitioners submit any comprehensive representation giving out the details of their data, which is yet to be corrected or pointing out the hardships qua the station, where they have been transferred and giving the details of the stations, where they can be accommodated as per the policy invoked, the said request will be considered sympathetically and an appropriate order will be passed within a period of two months on receipt of any such representation.

5. Learned counsel for the petitioners submit that in view of the statement of learned State counsel, the present petitions may kindly be disposed of having been not pressed any further with liberty to file appropriate representation for the sympathetic consideration of the respondents.

6. Ordered accordingly.

7. Since the main cases have been disposed of, pending application(s), if any, also stand disposed of.
