On 15.05.2023, the following order was passed by this Court:-

“Petitioner prayed for grant of anticipatory bail under Section 438 Cr.P.C. in case FIR No.83 dated 21.04.2023, registered under Sections 448, 511 & 379 of the IPC registered at Police Station Mandi Gobindgarh, District Fatehgarh Sahib.

Allegations are that complainant went to take round of her plot on 20.02.2023 along with his family members when petitioner and others abused him and dispute took place and in that fight, petitioner suffered injuries and the case was registered against the father and brother of the complainant. On 12.04.2023, complainant again went to the plot, where petitioner along with his father allegedly started demolishing boundary wall and other articles kept in the office.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that although the alleged occurrence took place on 12.04.2023, but the FIR has been registered after a

delay of 9 days i.e. on 21.04.2023. Not only this regarding the occurrence of 20.02.2023 as referred in the FIR (Annexure P-1), petitioner had sustained injuries and on his statement FIR No.37 dated 21.02.2023 was registered at Police Station Mandi Gobindgarh, District Fatehgarh Sahib, under Sections 323, 341, 506 & 34 of the IPC (copy Annexure P-2) against the complainant of this case.

It is also contended that similarly placed co-accused Manjeet Singh, the father of the petitioner had already been granted the benefit of anticipatory bail vide order dated 10.05.2023 in CRM-M-23709-2023.

Notice of motion.

Mr. Parneet Singh Pandher, AAG, Punjab, accepts notice on behalf of respondent-State. Copy of complete paper-book be supplied to him during the course of day.

To be put up along with CRM-M-23709-2023 on 31.07.2023 for filing status report.

In the meantime, petitioner is directed to join investigation and co-operate in the same. He will not leave the country without prior permission of the Court nor shall make any attempt to contact the complainant of the case or any witness associated with the case. In the event of the arrest of the petitioner, he shall be released on interim bail on his furnishing personal/surety bonds to the satisfaction of the Arresting Officer/Investigating Officer. He shall also abide by conditions as envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.”

Today, it is informed by learned State Counsel, on instructions from ASI Sukhwinder Singh, that in compliance of the order dated 15.05.2023, petitioner has since joined the investigation and he is no longer required for any investigation.

In view of the afore-said statement, order dated 15.05.2023 whereby interim anticipatory bail was granted to the petitioner in the FIR in question, is hereby made absolute. However, the petitioner shall continue to join the

investigation as and when required by the Investigating Officer and make compliance of the conditions envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.
