1. The petitioners are seeking the concession of bail under Section 438 Cr.P.C. in case FIR No.64/2022 dated 08.05.2022 for the offences under Sections 341, 323, 324, 452, 506, 447, 511, 148, 149 IPC registered at Police Station Sadar Ahemadgarh, District Malerkotla.

2. Vide order dated 15.05.2023, the petitioners had been granted the concession of interim bail in the following terms:-

“Learned counsel for the petitioners inter alia contends that it is a case of false implication as they are closely related to the wife of the complainant with whom he has a matrimonial dispute. While drawing the attention of this Court to the allegations levelled in the FIR, he submits that no doubt some injuries have been attributed to the petitioners, however, they all are simple in nature. It has

also been submitted that similarly situated co-accused have since been extended the concession of interim bail by this Court vide order dated 28.04.2023. He further submits that the petitioners are ready to join investigation and cooperate with the investigating agency.”

3. Learned counsel for the petitioners submits that in compliance of the order dated 15.05.2023, the petitioners have joined investigation and cooperated with the investigating agency.

4. Learned State counsel, on instructions, does not dispute the factum of the petitioners having joined investigation and cooperated with the investigating agency. He, on further instructions submits that the petitioners are not required for further investigation much less for their custodial interrogation.

5. In the circumstances, the petition is allowed and the interim order dated 15.05.2023 is made absolute subject to the conditions laid down in Section 438(2) Cr.P.C. Needless to say, in case the petitioners misuses the concession of bail granted to them, the State would be at liberty to seek cancellation of the bail granted to them.
