The prayer in the present petition under Section 482 Cr.P.C. is for quashing of the order dated 25.05.2022 (Annexure P-3) passed by the Judge, Special Court, Moga in case bearing No.NDPS/0430/2021 titled as State Versus Jaspal Singh in case FIR No.23 dated 25.02.2021 registered under Sections 21-B, 29 of NDPS Act, at Police Station City Moga, whereby the bail order has been cancelled and bail bonds have forfeited to the State.

When this matter had come up for hearing on 14.06.2022, the following order was passed:-

“This petition has been filed under Section 482 Cr.P.C. for quashing of orders dated 25.05.2022 (Annexure P-3) passed by Judge, Special Judge, Moga, in case bearing No.NDPS/0430/2021 titled as State Versus Jaspal Singh in case FIR No.23 dated 25.02.2021 under Section 21- B, 29 of NDPS Act, Police Station City Moga whereby bail order has been cancelled and bail bonds are forfeited to State.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that inadvertently, he was unable to appear before the Trial Court on one date i.e. 25.05.2022; on which date, the impugned order dated 25.05.2022 (Annexure P-3) was passed. Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that the petitioner is ready and willing to join the proceedings before the court.

Notice of motion.

Meanwhile, the petitioner shall surrender before the Trial Court within a period of one week from today and on his surrendering before the trial court, he shall be admitted to interim bail to its satisfaction.

Adjourned to 01.08.2022.”

Pursuant thereto, the learned counsel for the petitioner has placed on record an order dated 21.06.2022 passed by the Special Judge, Moga. The copy of the said order dated 21.06.2022 is marked as 'X'. He submits that the order of this Court dated 14.06.2022 has been complied with.

In view of the above, no further orders are required to be passed by this Court.

It is expected that the petitioner shall not absent himself from Trial without sufficient cause.
