The present petition has been filed under Section 482 Cr.P.C. for quashing of FIR No.25 dated 29.03.2018 registered under Sections 307, 506, 34 and 201 IPC and Sections 25 and 27 of the Arms Act, 1959 at Police Station Sadar, District Sangrur and all subsequent proceedings arising out of it on the basis of a compromise deed dated 02.11.2018 (Annexure P-2).

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that in the present case no injury has been caused to or by any person as the shots were allegedly fired in the air.

On 10.12.2018 and 21.01.2019 this Court had directed the parties to appear before the Trial Court for recording of their respective statements with regard to the compromise/settlement, who in turn was directed to submit a report along with the recorded statements with regard to

the veracity of the compromise, if any, between the parties as also to apprise this Court if there is any other case pending against them.

As directed, report dated 08.02.2019 from the Additional Sessions Judge, Sangrur has been received, as per which the parties had recorded their statements before the Trial Court in terms of the compromise arrived at between them and the same is genuine.

Learned State counsel has also raised no objection if the present petition is allowed.

In view of the above, continuation of the proceedings in pursuance of the afore-referred FIR which though contains Section 307 IPC but in which no injury was admittedly caused to or by any person and because the matter has been compromised, would be an abuse of the process of law and in terms of the law laid down by the Supreme Court in **Narinder Singh vs. State of Punjab, (2014) 6 SCC 466**, this Court deems it just and proper to allow the petition and resultantly quash the FIR No.25 dated 29.03.2018 registered under Sections 307, 506, 34 and 201 IPC and Sections 25 and 27 of the Arms Act, 1959 at Police Station Sadar, District Sangrur and all proceedings arising therefrom, qua the petitioners.
