Prayer in the instant petition under Section 482 Cr.P.C. is for issuance of directions to respondents No. 1 to 3 to enquire into the complaint of the petitioner and also to take appropriate action against respondents No. 4 to 11 who are harassing and threatening the petitioner and restraining him from attending the court proceedings.

Learned counsel for the petitioner *inter alia* contends that there is a serious threat to the life and liberty of petitioner at the hands of private respondents No. 4 to 11. Therefore, he has prayed for the protection of his life and liberty.

Undisputedly, there is a matrimonial dispute between the petitioner and respondent No.4- his wife, who had filed a petition under Section 125 Cr.P.C. for grant of maintenance under Domestic Violence Act and the said case is pending before the competent court of jurisdiction at

Karkardooma Courts, Delhi. When petitioner had gone to attend the court

proceedings on 28.01.2023 he was beaten up by some strangers at the railway station and he filed a written complaint before the concerned police station but no action has been taken by the Delhi police. Respondent No.4, wife of the petitioner, has lodged an FIR No. 82 dated 01.04.2022, under Sections 323, 406, 498-A, 506 IPC, registered at Police Station Women, Yamuna Nagar and the trial is pending before the Judicial Magistrate 1st Class, Yamuna Nagar at Jagadhri. The petitioner apprehends that he will be eliminated whenever he would go to attend the Court proceedings in the above mentioned FIR and he has moved a representation (Annexure P-3) before the respondent No.2-Superintendent of Police, Yamuna Nagar on 18.05.2023 but no action has been taken.

A perusal of Annexure P-3 indicates that the incident which has taken place on 28.01.2023, has been highlighted and no other specific incident or reason is mentioned in Annexure P-3 with regard to his harassment which has taken place within the jurisdiction of police at Yamuna Nagar.

This Court finds that the present petition requires to be dismissed because the apprehension as indicated in Annexure P-3 is over imaginative and unreasonable and this Court does not find any ground to issue any direction as sought by the petitioner in this petition.

Accordingly this petition is dismissed.
