On 26.05.2023, the following order was passed by this Court:-

“Prayer in the present petition is for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner in FIR No.63 dated 25.02.2023, under Sections 447, 379, 506, 120-B IPC, Police Station City Kharar, District SAS Nagar.

Notice of motion.

Mr. Tarun Aggarwal, Sr. DAG, Punjab accepts notice on behalf of respondent No.1-State whereas Mr. A.S. Brar, Advocate accepts notice on behalf of respondent No.2.

Learned counsel for the petitioner inter alia submits that the petitioner is ready to restore back the pillars and the barbed wire as alleged by the complainant within two weeks from today and is even ready to settle the dispute once for all.

In view thereof, let the matter be placed before the Mediation and Conciliation Centre of this Court on 30.05.2023. The parties shall be at liberty to join the mediation proceedings through video conferencing.

Adjourned to 10.10.2023.

In the meantime, the petitioner shall join the investigation and would come present as and when called for and in the event of arrest, he shall be admitted to interim bail to the satisfaction of the Arresting/Investigating Officer. The petitioner shall also abide by the conditions as specified under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.”

It is informed by learned State Counsel, on instructions from ASI Kulwinder Singh, that in compliance of the order dated 26.05.2023, petitioner has since joined the investigation and he is no longer required for any investigation.

In view of the afore-said statement, order dated 26.05.2023 whereby interim anticipatory bail was granted to the petitioner in the FIR in question, is hereby made absolute. However, the petitioner shall continue to join the investigation as and when required by the Investigating Officer and make compliance of the conditions envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.
