AMARJOT BHATTI J. (ORAL)

The petitioner-Daljinder Singh @ Bhola has filed the instant petition under Section 482 of Cr.P.C. for quashing of FIR No.93 dated 15.04.2022, registered under Sections 354, 354-A IPC at Police Station Sadar Amritsar, District Police Commissionerate Amritsar and all other subsequent proceedings on the basis of compromise between the parties (Annexure P-2).

The brief facts of the case are that complainant- Kuldeep Kaur gave her statement that she got married with Gurdeep Singh. Her maternal father-in-law Daljinder Singh @ Bhola was residing in their neighbourhood. He being relative was visiting their house. On 08.04.2022, she was working in the kitchen when Daljinder Singh @ Bhola came in her house and hugged her from behind and started kissing her. She ran out of the house out of

fear. She disclosed this fact to her husband and the matter was reported to the police and ultimately, the FIR was got registered.

The petitioner filed this petition for the quashing of aforesaid FIR on the basis of compromise. The petitioner and respondent No.2 were directed to appear before the trial Court/Illaq Magistrate for recording their statements on the basis of compromise. The detailed report regarding compromise has been received from the court of Additional Chief Judicial Magistrate, Amritsar dated 02.12.2022. The statement of respondent No.2- Kuldeep Kaur has been recorded, where she confirmed the compromise with the petitioner. She confirmed that this compromise has been effected without any pressure, coercion from any side and she has no objection regarding quashing of FIR.

The petitioner- Daljinder Singh @ Bhola also confirmed this fact in his separate statement. The statement of SI Manpreet Kaur is also recorded who further confirmed that the accused is neither involved in any other case nor has been declared as proclaimed offender.

Therefore, from the report of Additional Chief Judicial Magistrate, Amritsar it is clear that the compromise has been effected between the parties without any pressure, coercion or undue influence, which is acceptable to both the parties. They have mutually settled all the disputes. They are close relatives living in neighbourhood. They will be able to live in peace and harmony. It will also prevent future litigation. No purpose would be served with the continuation of criminal proceedings.

Therefore considering these facts the petition filed by the petitioner is accepted and FIR No.93 dated 15.04.2022, registered under Sections 354, 354-A IPC at Police Station Sadar Amritsar, District Police

Commissionerate Amritsar and the consequential proceedings arising there from are quashed.

Accordingly, the present petition stands disposed of.
