1. This writ petition has been filed under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India for issuance of a writ in the nature of mandamus directing respondents No.1 and 2 to take action against the Managing Committee of the respondent on the points mentioned in the writ petition.
2. On 01.06.2023, this Court was pleased to pass the following order: -

“Learned counsel for the petitioners has submitted that the limited prayer which the petitioners are making in the present writ petition is for conclusion of the inquiry, in which, inquiry officer was appointed vide letter dated 02.07.2021 (Annexure P-17) and a new inquiry officer has now been appointed vide letter dated 04.02.2022 (Annexure P-18).
