Prayer in this petitioner filed under Section 439 Cr.P.C. is for grant of regular bail in case FIR No.100, dated 04.03.2023, under Sections 21-B, 27-A of the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act,1985 (for short 'the NDPS Act'), registered at Police Station Sadar Yamunanagar, District Yamunanagar.

It is contended by learned counsel for the petitioner that smack weighing 07 grams, including the weight of the polythene, was allegedly recovered from the possession of co-accused Ashik and that on the basis of disclosure statement of Ashik, petitioner has been nominated to be the supplier. Learned counsel further contends that no recovery was effected from the petitioner, nor he is involved in such other case.

Learned State counsel does not dispute the aforesaid facts. However, the bail petition is opposed on the ground that petitioner is involved in one more case, but it is admitted that the same does not pertain to NDPS Act.

Having regard to the fact that no recovery has been effected from the petitioner, nor the petitioner is involved in other case under the

NDPS Act, but without commenting anything further on the merits of the case, the petitioner is admitted to regular bail. He is ordered to be released on bail on his furnishing bail bonds and surety bonds to the satisfaction of learned Trial Court/Duty Magistrate concerned.
