Present petitions have been filed under Section 482 of Cr.P.C. for quashing of impugned criminal complaint bearing No. 83 dated 10.10.2017 (Anneuxre P-4) and the impugned summoning order dated 08.09.2021 (Annexure P-5) passed by the trial Court vide which the petitioners have been summoned to face trial under Sections 406, 420, 494, 506 and 120-B IPC.

Learned counsel for the parties submit that the settlement/agreement *inter se* the parties have been arrived at on 23.03.2023 before the Mediation and Conciliation Centre. The terms of the settlement read thus:

“The following settlement has been arrived at between the parties hereto:

i) Since the marriage has been annulled between the party No. 2 and Bhupinder Kaur by the Family Court, Ludhiana therefore the parties to the lis have agreed that they will not raise any civil or criminal

dispute regarding their marriage in any court of law or before any other forum.

ii) Both the parties have agreed that they shall not claim any amount from each other. If the Id. Family Court has fixed any maintenance in favour of Bhupinder Kaur and against party No. 2. Bhupinder Kaur has agreed that she will not claim any arrears of maintenance or any other maintenance in future.

iii) The party No. 2 has agreed to withdraw this complaint pending in the trial Court at Moga before the date fixed in the aforesaid quashing petitions pending before the Hon'ble High Court and thereafter the party No. 1 have agreed to withdraw their respective criminal misc. pending before the Punjab and Haryana High Court.

iv) The party No. 2 and Bhupinder Kaur have agreed to live their peaceful life separately and further agreed that they will not interfere into their lives.

v) It has been further mutually agreed by both the parties that if any other case is pending before any competent court of law/authority, which is not in the knowledge of either of the parties or has escaped their attention shall also be withdrawn by them.”

In view of the aforesaid, they submit that the party No. 2 i.e. the respondent shall withdraw the complaint, quashing of which alongwith summoning order has been sought in the present petition and party No. 1 has agreed to withdraw their respective criminal miscellaneous pending before this Court. They pray for disposing of the case in terms of the aforesaid.

The present petition stands disposed of accordingly. The parties shall remain bound by the terms of the settlement.
