VIKAS BAHL, J.(ORAL)

1. This is a civil writ petition filed under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India for issuance of a writ especially in the nature of mandamus directing the respondents to grant four additional marks as per weightage for his graduation at the time of re-scrutiny of documents in compliance with the orders passed by this Court as per judgment dated 16.05.2023 (Annexure P-6).

2. Learned counsel for the petitioner has submitted that for the grievances raised by the petitioner, the petitioner has filed a representation (Annexure P-8) and would be satisfied in case the Secretary, Haryana Staff Selection Commission, considers the same in a time bound manner and after considering the same, in case, the plea of the petitioner is found to be meritorious, then necessary relief be granted to the petitioner.

Haryana Staff Selection Commission would look into the representation (Annexure P-8) within a period of four weeks from the date of receipt of certified copy of the present order, in accordance with law.

4. Keeping in view the above said facts and circumstances, the present petition is disposed of with a direction to the Secretary, Haryana Staff Selection Commission, to consider the representation (Annexure P-8) of the petitioner, in accordance with law, within a period of four weeks from the date of receipt of certified copy of the present order and in case, after considering the same, the plea of the petitioner is found to be meritorious, then necessary relief be granted to the petitioner and in case, the plea of the petitioner is not found to be meritorious, then a speaking order rejecting the same be passed within a period of six weeks from the date of receipt of certified copy of the present order.

4. It is made clear that this Court has not opined on the merits of the case and the Secretary, Haryana Staff Selection Commission, would consider and decide the representation independently, in accordance with law.
