Prayer is for grant for anticipatory bail to the petitioner
in case having FIR No.0105 dated 04.08.2021 registered under
Sections 406, 420 IPC, Police Station Amloh, District Fatehgarh
Sahib.

The allegations in brief are that the petitioner lured
complainant Lakhvir Kaur and took Rs.4,78,000/- and gold jewellery
from the complainant on pretext of sending her abroad but thereafter

the petitioner failed to do so and also refused to return the aforesaid money and gold ornaments.

Today the counsel for the petitioner apprised the Court that in compliance of the previous order, the petitioner joined the investigation and also deposited Rs.1.5 lac in the Court of Illaqa Magistrate concerned and copy of the concerned receipt is taken on record.

The counsel appearing on behalf of the complainant submits that the petitioner committed fraud by taking money and jewellery from the complainant, in order to send her abroad but thereafter the petitioner failed to fulfill his promise and also refused to return the money.

The State counsel on instructions from ASI Sanjeev Kumar submits that the petitioner has joined the investigation with the police and is not required for any further investigation or custodial interrogation by the police. The State counsel has not disputed the fact regarding deposit of Rs.1.5 lac by the petitioner in the Court concerned.

In view of the above, without commenting on the merits of the case, present petition is allowed and order granting interim bail dated 06.12.2021 to the petitioner is hereby made absolute subject to the conditions envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C. However, the Court concerned below is at liberty to disburse the aforesaid amount

of Rs.1.5 lac which the petitioner has deposited to the complainant, if she herself moves an application in this regard.

Disposed of accordingly, so also the pending miscellaneous application(s), if any.
