This is a civil writ petition filed under Article 226 of the Constitution of India for issuance of a writ in the nature of mandamus directing the respondents to promote the petitioner to the post of Head Constable w.e.f. 28.01.2018. A further prayer has been made in the writ petition for directing the respondents to depute the petitioner for Intermediate School Course for the year 2023.

2. Learned counsel for the petitioner has submitted that for the grievances raised by the petitioner, the petitioner has given a representation dated 11.06.2023 (Annexure P-10) to the respondent authorities. It is further submitted that the petitioner would give a detailed representation to the Superintendent of Police, Hisar, Police Line, Hisar, Haryana detailing his grievances and referring to all the relevant facts and has prayed that he would be satisfied in case respondent no.4 is directed to consider the said

representation, in accordance with law, in a time bound manner.

3. Learned State counsel has stated that in case a detailed representation is filed by the petitioner, the same would be considered by respondent no.4, in accordance with law, within a period of two months from the date of receipt of said representation.

4. Keeping in view the above said facts and circumstances, the present petition is disposed of with a direction to respondent no.4 to consider the detailed representation to be filed by the petitioner, within a period of two months from the date of receipt of the said detailed representation, in accordance with law.

5. It is made clear that this Court has not opined on the merits of the case and respondent no.4 would consider the representation independently, in accordance with law.
