N.S. SHEKHAWAT, J.

1. The petitioner has filed the present petition under Article 226 of the Constitution of India with a prayer to direct respondent No.2 to consider the representation dated 17.03.2023 (Annexure P-3) and also to protect the life and liberty of the petitioner and her family members at the hands of respondents No.4 to 6.

2. Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that petitioner is an old widow and her son and daughter are living separately. The petitioner had inherited some ancestral property from her late husband Avtar Singh at their native place Raqba, District Ludhiana. Respondents No.4 to 6, who are relatives of the petitioner, wanted to grab the property of the petitioner illegally. Learned counsel further contends that even the petitioner has filed a civil suit, which is pending. He next contends that the private respondents are harassing and threatening the petitioner and her family members to withdraw the civil suit filed by the petitioner. He also contends that the

petitioner has already submitted a representation (Annexure P-3) to the

Commissioner of Police, Ludhiana-respondent No.2 and the petitioner shall be satisfied in case appropriate directions are issued to respondent No.2 to look into the representation and to take appropriate action, in accordance with law.

3. Notice of motion.

4. On the asking of Court, Mr. M.S. Bajwa, DAG, Punjab, accepts notice.

5. After hearing the learned counsel for the parties and without commenting anything on the merits of the case, the present petition is disposed of with a direction to the Commissioner of Police, Ludhiana-respondent No.2 to look into the representation (Annexure P-3) and to depute a senior officer to get the enquiry conducted with regard to the allegations levelled by the petitioner in her representation (Annexure P-3) and to take appropriate action, as per law, as early as possible.

6. Needless to say that the learned Civil Court shall decide the civil suit filed by the petitioner without being influenced by the observations made hereinabove.
