Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that the petitioner has been falsely implicated in the present case. Even as per the admitted case of the prosecution, he was carrying four cows and one calf and it cannot be stated that the cows were being transported for slaughtering. Even he was not present at the place, from where the cows and calf have been recovered.

On the other hand, learned State counsel, on instruction from SI Darshan, has vehemently opposed the grant of concession of anticipatory bail to the petitioner on the ground that six more cases were also registered against the present petitioner, however she admits that in four cases, he has been acquitted and in one more case, he is on bail.

I have heard learned counsel for the parties and perused the record.

Without commenting on the merits of the case, the present petition is allowed. The petitioner is granted concession of anticipatory bail, subject to the conditions as provided under Section 438(2) of the Cr.P.C.

It will be open for the Investigating Officer to call the petitioner to join investigation, if so required, by issuing a written notice in this regard and he shall abide by the conditions mentioned in Section 438(2) of the Cr.P.C.
