1 This appeal has been filed by the appellant-wife challenging judgment dated 20.01.2009 passed by learned Additional District Judge (I), Jind whereby petition under Section 13 of Hindu Marriage Act, 1955 filed by respondent-husband seeking dissolution of marriage, has been allowed.

2 Learned counsel for the parties inform that the respondent has since unfortunately passed away.

3 Learned counsel for the appellant submits that at the time of filing of this appeal and thereafter too the appellant was residing with her children who are the legal heirs of the respondent.

4 We notice that it was also the case of the respondent-husband that appellant-wife along with her three sons had expelled him from his own house and had taken possession of his agricultural land in village Siwaha.

5 Learned counsel for the appellant submits that despite best efforts to contact the appellant, he has been unable to do so and he pleads no instructions at this stage.

6 Keeping in view the facts and circumstances as above, this appeal is dismissed for non-prosecution.
