1. Applicant – Manpreet Kaur, who is the respondent in the divorce petition filed by her husband Nirmal Singh against her pending in the Court of Principal Judge, Family Court, Patiala by way of filing the present application under Section 24 CPC, seeks transfer of the said petition from the Court of Principal Judge, Family Court, Patiala to the Court of competent jurisdiction at Chandigarh.

2. The reason given for the transfer is that applicant is residing along with her minor daughter at her parental house at Chandigarh; the minor daughter is studying in a school at Mohali; the parents of the applicant are old and sick and it is difficult for her to go from Chandigarh to Patiala covering a distance of 66 kms. on one side to attend the dates of hearing there and further two more cases between the parties are pending.

3. I have heard learned counsel for the applicant besides going through the record.

4. A perusal of the copy of the divorce petition, which has been placed on record by the applicant herself goes to show that while seeking divorce her husband Nirmal Singh has levelled grave and serious allegations of immorality against her stating that she has been indulging in such acts under the guise of Saloon and when the husband objected to that, she picked up quarrels and started threatening him. With such type of allegations against the applicant, I do not find it proper and appropriate to accept the application and transfer the divorce petition to the Court of competent jurisdiction at Chandigarh.

5. Finding no merit in the petition, the same stands dismissed.
