The present application has been moved by the applicant to implead the accused namely, Gurmej Singh @ Bau as petitioner No.8.

For the reasons mentioned in the application, the same is allowed and the petitioner namely Gurmej Singh @ Bau son of Gulab Singh resident of Othian, Ajnala, Amritsar is ordered to be impleaded as petitioner No.8 in the main petition. The amended memo of parties is taken on record.

At the very outset, learned counsel for respondents No.2 and 3 submits that the matter has been settled with newly added respondent No.8 also and he has no objection in case, the FIR is ordered to be quashed qua him as well.

Main case

1. The instant petition has been filed under Section 482 Cr.P.C. for quashing of General Entry No.39 dated 25.09.2022 under Sections 323,324,148,149 of IPC registered at Police Station Ajnala, District Amritsar (Annexure P-1) alongwith all the consequential proceedings arising therefrom on the basis of compromise Annexure P-2.

2. Vide order dated 19.07.2023, while issuing notice of motion, this Court had directed the parties to appear before the Illaqa Magistrate/trial Magistrate for getting their statements recorded with respect to the compromise Annexure P-2.

3. Pursuant to aforesaid order, the parties have appeared before the SDJM, Ajnala and got their statements recorded. Report dated 10.08.2023 has been received whereby after recording the statements of the parties, the Court below has shown its satisfaction that the compromise is genuine, voluntary and without any coercion or undue influence.

4. I have heard counsel for the parties and gone through the case file.

5. In the light of the satisfaction shown by the Court below and considering the offence for which the accused have been charged are not of serious nature, together with the fact that compromise will go a long way in ironing out the differences for betterment of future life of the parties and also in view of the law laid down in **Gian Singh Vs. State of Punjab and another, 2012 (4) RCR (Criminal) 543** and **Kulwinder Singh and others Vs. State of Punjab 2007(3) RCR (Criminal) 1052**, the present petition for quashing the FIR is allowed qua the petitioners.

6. Resultantly, General Entry No.39 dated 25.09.2022 under Sections

323,324,148,149 of IPC registered at Police Station Ajnala, District Amritsar (Annexure P-1) alongwith all consequential proceedings arising therefrom are hereby quashed qua the petitioners.

7. All other pending applications, if any, disposed off, accordingly.
