Present petition has been filed under Section 482 Cr.P.C. praying for quashing of FIR No.0064 dated 23.05.2021, under Sections 336, 452, 148 read with Section 149 of the Indian Penal Code, 1860 (for short, '*the IPC*'); Sections 25 & 27 of the Arms Act, 1959; registered at Police Station, Ramdas, District Amritsar (Rural), on the basis of compromise entered into between the parties, i.e. petitioners as well as respondent No.2.

2. It transpires that Coordinate Bench on 03.11.2021, passed the following order:-

“Case has been heard through video conferencing on account of Covid-19 Pandemic.

The petitioners have filed this petition under Section 482 Cr.P.C. for quashing of FIR No.64 dated 23.5.2021 registered under

Sections 336, 452, 148, 149 IPC & Sections 25/27 of Arms Act, at Police Station Ramdas, District Amritsar on the basis of compromise (Annexure P-2).

Notice of motion.

At this stage, Mr. Gurjinder Singh Thind, Advocate, accepts notice on behalf of the respondent No.2 and admitted the correctness of aforesaid compromise.

On the asking of this Court, Mr. Tanvir Joshi, AAG, Punjab accepts notice on behalf of the respondent No.1-State and he does not intend to file any reply in this case as the matter has been compromised between the parties.

*In the light of the no objection on behalf of counsel for respondent No.2, the parties are directed to appear before the learned trial court/Illaq Magistrate on **30.11.2021** and to get record their statements regarding compromise and after recording their statements, learned trial Court/Illaq Magistrate, is directed to send the same along with its report specifically with regard to the following facts : -*

- 1. Number of persons arrayed as accused in the FIR.*
- 2. Whether any accused is proclaimed offender.*
- 3. Stage of the trial/proceedings.*
- 4. Whether the compromise is genuine, voluntary and without any coercion or undue influence.*
- 5. Total number of victims and their names.*

*To come up on **13.1.2022** for awaiting the report.*

A copy of this order be sent to the learned trial Court/Illaq Magistrate, through electronic mode, for compliance.”

3. Again, the matter was posted for 07.07.2023 and parties were granted another opportunity for recording their statements, but till date, none has chosen to appear before the Court concerned.

4. In view of the above, this Court is satisfied that there is no compromise between the parties as on today.

5. In view of the above, present petition stands disposed off, accordingly.
6. Needless to say that in case an occasion so arises, petitioners would be at liberty to take recourse to the remedy, as per law.
7. Pending application(s), if any, shall also stand disposed off.
