1. On 04.05.2023, the following order was passed:-

“In the two connected writ petitions, the petitioners are praying for completing the selection process pursuant to the recruitment notice dated 12.10.2011.

On the one hand, the learned counsel representing the petitioners contends that the process of selection was not completed, whereas, on the other hand, the learned counsel representing the State of Punjab has submitted that PEPSU Road Transport Corporation was directed to

take the selection process to a logical end.

The learned counsel representing the Corporation submits that after conducting the driving test, the matter was forwarded to the government on 19.08.2019.

The learned counsel representing the State of Punjab prays for some time to get complete instructions before further assisting the Court.

2. While producing the order dated 14.07.2022, the learned counsel representing the State submits that a decision has been taken by the competent authorities to scrap the selection in view of certain serious irregularities in carrying out this process.

A photocopy of the order dated 14.07.2022 has been produced by the learned counsel representing the State with a copy to the learned counsels representing the petitioners, who pray for the permission to withdraw the present writ petitions in order to have a remedy against the aforesaid decision.
