This writ petition has been filed under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India for issuance of a writ in the nature of certiorari/mandamus for setting aside the orders dated 30.07.2010 (P-5) passed by respondent No.3; order dated 23.05.2012 (P-6) passed by respondent No.2; and order dated 22.04.2014 (P-7) passed by respondent No.1 whereby respondent No.4 has been appointed as the Lambardar.

Learned counsel for the petitioner has submitted that respondent No.4 has subsequently been removed from the post of Lambardar, vide order dated 19.08.2019 and the appeal was also dismissed, vide order dated 25.03.2022 and thus, a fresh process for the appointment of Lambardar has been initiated. It is submitted that in view

of the said fact, the present writ petition has been rendered infructuous and the same may be disposed of as such. It is prayed that the petitioner would also like to apply for the post of Lambardar, which proceedings have begun afresh after the removal of respondent No.4 from the said post and liberty be granted to the petitioner to apply for the post of Lambardar.

In view of the above, the present writ petition is disposed of as having been rendered infructuous. Liberty is granted to the petitioner to apply for the post of the Lambardar, fresh proceedings for which have been initiated after the removal of respondent No.4 as the Lambardar.
