2. Prayer in the present writ petition, filed under Article 226/227 of the Constitution of India is for directions to respondent No.2 to take appropriate decision on the application of the petitioner dated 01.08.2018 (Annexure P-13) for renewal of the license keeping in view the representation of the petitioner dated 07/25.03.2019.

3. The State had taken time that hearing in the matter was fixed pursuant to the show cause notice dated 20.05.2021 (Annexure P-26).

4. In the reply filed, the order passed by the Director General, Town & Country Planning, Haryana dated 16.02.2023 (Annexure R-1) has been attached wherein the benefit has been granted to treat the litigation period from 21.12.2016 till the final outcome of the suit as 'zero period' w.r.t. charging of renewal fee and interest on EDC/IDC for licence No.57 of 2010 dated 02.08.2010.

5. Keeping in view the above, we are of the considered opinion that the writ petition has been rendered infructuous to the extent that a decision has been taken on the above-said representation. In case the petitioner is still aggrieved against the said decision, it will always be open to him to challenge the same in accordance with law.

6. With the above-said observations, the present writ petition stands disposed of.
