MEENAKSHI I. MEHTA, J.(Oral)

Learned counsel for respondent No.1/Cross-Objector informs the Court that he had sent a letter to his client, through registered post, for seeking further instructions in respect of the Cross-Objections but as per the report made by the employee of the Postal Department on the envelope containing the said letter, the addressee, i.e the Cross-Objector, has died. He has submitted the said envelope as well as the relevant postal-receipt regarding the said letter having been sent through the registered post, along-with another postal-receipt qua his having sent another letter to the

Cross-Objector through Speed Post, in the Court and these documents are taken on the record. He further submits that neither the legal representatives of the Cross-Objector have ever contacted him nor any one else on their behalf has approached him till date, for pursuing the Cross-Objections further nor he has any clue about the details of such LR's, if any.

Today, none has appeared in the Court also for being impleaded as the legal representative of the said Cross-Objector.

In view of the above-discussed scenario, this Court is left with no option but to dismiss the Cross-Objections for want of prosecution.

Resultantly, the same stand dismissed accordingly.
