JAGMOHAN BANSAL, J. (Oral)

1. By this common order CWP-3543-2015, CWP-3368-2015 and CWP-3549-2015 are hereby disposed of since issue involved in all the petitions and prayer sought are common. With the consent of parties and for the sake of brevity, facts are borrowed from CWP-3543-2015.

2. The petitioner through instant petition under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India is seeking setting aside of order dated 10.12.2014 (Annexure P-6) whereby Tribunal cum Labour Court has passed award in favour of the respondent.

3. The Labour Court vide impugned order has directed the petitioner to pay 25% of wages of the respondents from 1989. The Labour Court has further directed the petitioner to reinstate respondents.

- 4.Learned counsel for the respondents submits that grievance of the respondents would be redressed if petitioner makes 25% wages for the period from 1989 to the date of order passed by Labour Court.
- 5.Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that petitioner at the time of admission of present petition had deposited a sum of Rs.1 lakh with Labour Court and said amount is still lying with Labour Court. The petitioner is further ready to pay a sum of Rs.1 lakh to each respondent.
- 6.Learned counsel for the respondents agrees with the aforesaid arrangement.
- 7.In the wake of statements of both sides, the petitions stand disposed of with a direction to Labour Court to release the amount deposited by petitioner to respondents, if already not released, within 4 weeks from today alongwith accrued interest. The petitioner shall further pay a sum of Rs.1 lakh to each respondent within 2 weeks from today.
- 8.The petitioner shall prepare three demand drafts in favour of the respective respondents and handover copy thereof to learned counsel for the respondents.
- 9.Pending misc. application(s), if any, shall also stand disposed of.
