The prayer in the present petition under Section 439 Cr.P.C. is for the grant of regular bail to the petitioner in case FIR No26 dated 27.02.2023 under Sections 307, 160, 148, 149 IPC registered at Police Station Shimlapuri, District Ludhiana, Punjab.

2. The present FIR came to be registered by the investigating agency on the basis of secret information made available to them to the effect that two parties had attacked each other with an intention to kill and members of both the parties had received injuries.

3. The learned counsel for the petitioner contends that a compromise had been arrived at between the parties and therefore, as the petitioner was in custody since 01.03.2023, he was entitled to the concession of bail, moreso, when two similarly situated co-accused, namely Sajandeep

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Singh and Paramjit Singh @ Kala had been granted the concession of bail vide a common order dated 21.07.2023 (Annexure P-2) passed in CRM-M-19782-2023 and CRM-M-21977-2023 respectively.

4. The learned counsel for the State does not dispute the factual aspect as contended by the learned counsels for the petitioner. He also admits that the petitioner was in custody since 01.03.2023 and two co-accused of the petitioner, namely, Sajandeep Singh and Paramjit Singh Kala had been granted the similar concession vide order dated 21.07.2023 (Annexure P-2).

5. I have heard the learned counsel for the parties.

6. Admittedly, the FIR came to be registered on the basis of secret information received by the investigating agency, as per which two sides had quarreled with each other leading to the injuries being suffered by both the parties. Now a compromise has been arrived at, and therefore, no useful purpose would be served by keeping the petitioner incarcerated, moreso, when two similarly situated co-accused, namely, Sajandeep Singh and Paramjit Singh Kala have been granted the similar concession vide order dated 21.07.2023 (Annexure P-2)..

7. Thus, without commenting upon the merits of the case, the present petition is allowed and the petitioner, namely, Prabhjot Singh @ Bobby is ordered to be released on bail to the satisfaction of the Trial Court/Duty Magistrate concerned.
