The petitioner is seeking regular bail by way of petition filed under Section 439 Cr.P.C in case FIR No.385 dated 13.10.2022 registered under Section 20B(ii)C of Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act, 1985 registered at Police Station Uklana, District Hisar.

2. It is contended by learned counsel for the petitioner that 18.900 kg of charas was allegedly recovered from the possession of co-accused Vikram. Learned counsel further contends that petitioner is not named in the FIR and that it is only on the basis of disclosure statement of said Vikram that petitioner has been nominated to the effect that he had supplied the car. Learned counsel further contends that petitioner has been falsely implicated having no criminal antecedents and even the car never belonged to him.
3. Notice of motion.
4. Mr. Randhir Singh, Addl. AG, Haryana accepts notice on behalf

of respondent- State.

5. Custody certificate has been placed on record by learned State counsel reveals that petitioner is in custody for the last 10 months and 06 days with no criminal antecedents. Learned State counsel concedes that no recovery has been effected from the petitioner.

6. Having regard the aforesaid facts and circumstances, but without commenting anything further on the merits of the case, this petition is allowed and petitioner is admitted to bail on his furnishing bail bonds/surety bonds to the satisfaction of the Learned Trial Court/Duty Magistrate concerned, on usual terms and conditions.
