VIKAS BAHL, J.(ORAL)

1. This is a civil writ petition filed under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India for issuance of a writ in the nature of mandamus directing the official respondents to correct the name of the mother of the petitioner to Munesh Kumari instead of Munesh Devi in the mark sheet of Secondary School Examination, 2016 issued by respondent no.3.

2. Learned counsel for the petitioner has submitted that the entire issue with respect to changes/corrections to be made in the certificate issued by the Central Board of Secondary Education has been adjudicated upon by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in a detailed judgment passed in case titled as ***Jigyra Yadav (minor) (through Guardian/father Hari Singh) Vs. CBSE (Central Board of Secondary Education) and others*** and other connected

Supreme Court and has prayed that the petitioner be permitted to file a representation keeping in view the parameters laid down in the abovesaid judgment and prays that respondents no.2 and 3 be directed to consider the said representation and pass a speaking order within a period of six weeks from the date the said representation is received by respondents no.2 and 3.

3. Learned counsel appearing for respondents no.2 and 3-Board has stated that the petitioner is required to submit list of documents and a copy of the said list has been supplied to learned counsel for the petitioner and once the petitioner supplies the said documents to respondents no.2 and 3, then necessary relief, in accordance with law, would be granted to the petitioner.

4. Keeping in view the abovesaid facts and circumstances, the present petition is disposed of with the direction that the petitioner would submit the documents as required by respondents no.2 and 3 as early as possible and on supplication of the same, respondents no.2 and 3 would take necessary action, in accordance with law, within a period of six weeks from the date of the said documents being supplied.
