TRIBHUVAN DAHIYA J. (ORAL):

This petition has been filed under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India for issuing a writ of *certiorari* for quashing the action of the respondents in declaring the petitioner ineligible for the post of Trained Graduate Teacher (TGT) English and not calling him for interview for the post as per result dated 19.2.2017 (Annexure P-11).

2. As per the Mewat District School Education (Group-C) Service Rules, 2012, and the qualifications prescribed therein, an eligible candidate has to acquire B.A. degree with atleast 50% marks as well as English as an Elective Subject, and one year Bachelor of Education (B. Ed.).

3. Undisputedly, the petitioner did not possess the requisite qualifications, and was, therefore, declared ineligible. The detailed marks certificate (DMC) of the Bachelor of Arts Part-III Examination, held in September 2001 (Annexure P-1), shows that the petitioner obtained 606

out of 1200 marks, which comes to 50.5%, but obtained 125 marks out of 300 in English subject, which comes to 41.66% only, as is apparent from the reply filed by respondent no.3. Therefore, the petitioner did not have the requisite 50% marks in English Elective subject.

- 4. In view thereof, there is no ground to entertain the petition.
- 5. Dismissed.
