

accepts notice on behalf of the respondent-State. She has submitted before this Court that the State would abide by the law and rules.

After hearing learned counsel for the parties and perusing the record, the present petition is disposed of with liberty to the petitioner to approach the respondent-authorities for filing his objections/reply to the notice issued to him. The respondent concerned would hear the objections/reply and take decision on the same before taking further action in pursuant to the notice.

It has been submitted before this Court that today is the last day for appearing before the respondent-authorities and thus, the petitioner does not have further time to appear and in case his house is demolished, the same would result into grave injustice to him and his family. Resultantly, keeping in view the peculiar facts and circumstances of the case, the petitioner is granted 10 days more time for appearing before the respondent-authorities to enable him to file his objections/reply. In case the petitioner appears before the concerned authorities and files his objections/reply within aforesaid period, the same would be decided as in accordance with the law.

Till then no coercive action be taken against the petitioner in pursuance to the notice issued. However, it is being made clear that in case the petitioner does not appear before the concerned authorities within the aforesaid period of 10 days, this order would be of no avail to the petitioner.

Copy of this order be given *dasti* to learned counsel for the petitioner under the signature of the Bench Secretary.
