1. Petitioner incarcerated in the FIR captioned above, has come before this Court under Section 439 Cr.P.C. seeking regular bail.
2. In Paragraph 20, of the petition, petitioner declares that he is not involved in any other case of NDPS Act, however State counsel submits that petitioner is involved in two more cases of other offences in addition to the present case of NDPS Act and supplied copy of the custody certificate. State Counsel prayed for the dismissal of the present petition on the ground of concealment.
3. Faced with the strong opposition from the State, counsel for the petitioner submits that the mistake is bonafide because of lack of

miscommunication, not intentional and seeks permission to withdraw the present petition with liberty to file fresh one by disclosing all criminal antecedents. Counsel for the petitioner further submits that he may be permitted to file fresh petition without fresh power of attorney.

4. Given above, present petition stands disposed of as withdrawn with liberty to file fresh petition with better particulars. There shall be no need for the counsel to file fresh power of attorney with the fresh petition and power of attorney filed in this petition shall suffice. All pending applications(s), if any, stand disposed of.
