The present petitioner has filed the present petition under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India for issuance of a writ in the nature of mandamus to direct the respondents No.1 to 4 to protect the life and liberty of the petitioner. A further prayer has been made to direct the respondent No.2 to decide the representation dated 21.04.2023 (Annexure P-1), submitted by the petitioner.

A detailed reply by way of affidavit of Deputy Superintendent of Police, Sub-Division, Amloh, District Fatehgarh Sahib has been filed on behalf of respondents No.1 to 4 and the same is taken on record.

Learned State counsel submits that the representation dated 21.04.2023 (Annexure P-1) was submitted by the petitioner, which was marked for inquiry to DSP, Circle, Khamano. As per the Inquiry Officer, Kamal Kumar Ahuja had expired in the year 2022. During inquiry it was found that the matter

pertained to GST Department and no action by the police was required.

Consequently, a complaint submitted by the petitioner was ordered to be filed. He further contends that no substance was found in the representation dated 21.04.2023 (Annexure P-1) submitted by the petitioner and the same was accordingly ordered to be filed by the Higher Police Officials.

In view of the statement made by the learned State counsel, no further orders are required and the petition is accordingly disposed off.

Needless to say that the parties shall be at liberty to avail their alternative remedies in accordance with law.
