The petitioner through instant petition under Section 482 Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973, is seeking direction to the official respondents to register a criminal case against respondent No.4- Jagannath.

There was no representation on behalf of the petitioner on 09.03.2022 and even today, there is no change in the situation.

From the perusal of paper book, it appears that petitioner lodged complaint with police authorities against respondent No.4 however, parties arrived at compromise dated 18.06.2019 (Annexure P-2). The petitioner is alleging that compromise was outcome of pressure of police authorities and it was not voluntary.

The State has filed reply way of affidavit dated 02.12.2019 disclosing that compromise was voluntary and there was no intervention

of the police authorities. The petitioner in the presence of her relatives and on the asking of co-villagers compromised the matter, thus, allegations of the petitioner are false and concocted.

There is no representation of the petitioner. It appears that with the passage of time the petitioner has lost her interest to pursue the matter.

Without commenting on merits of the case, the present petition is disposed of with liberty to the petitioner to avail remedies as permissible by law if she still feels aggrieved from the act and conduct of the authorities.

Disposed of with aforesaid liberty.
