One of the main ground for seeking regular bail is that the trial is not progressing at a decent pace.

Reply filed is taken on record.

Learned State counsel relying upon the pleading of reply filed and on instructions submits that two prosecution witnesses are remaining and next date fixed before the trial Court is 23rd January, 2023. He submits that earnest effort would be made to examine the remaining prosecution witnesses not later than 15.2.2023.

In view of the statement made by learned State counsel, learned counsel for the petitioner is not pressing the present petition at this stage.

Dismissed as not pressed.

There is no doubt that in case a request is made before the Court concerned for accommodating the date for expeditious examination of the prosecution witnesses, the same would be considered in accordance with law

Since the main case has been decided, the pending application, if any is rendered infructuous.
