The prayer in the present petition under Section 482 Cr.P.C. is for quashing of the order dated 17.09.2022 (Annexure P-1) and the order dated 17.09.2022 (Annexure P-2) passed by the JMIC, SBS Nagar in complaint case under Section 1738 of the NI Act titled Narang Singh Vs. Parshotam Lal bearing NACT No.532/2018.

On 14.09.2023, the following order was passed:-

“The learned counsel for the petitioner contends that a compromise has been arrived at in furtherance of which a sum of Rs.3,00,000/- already stands paid to the complainant and the remaining amount of Rs.3,00,000/- shall be paid within the next 08 weeks.

Notice of motion for 29.11.2023.

Mr. Kirat Singh Sidhu, DAG, Punjab, for respondent No.1-State accepts notice.

Mr.Vijay Kumar, Advocate, appearing for the complainantrespondent No.2, accept notice and submits that he has no objection if the petitioner is admitted to interim bail.

In the meantime, the operation of the order dated 17.09.2022 (Annexure P-2) shall remain stayed. The

petitioner is directed to surrender before the Trial Court within a period of one week from today and subject to a deposit of Rs.25,000/- as costs with the Institute for the Blind, Sector 26, Chandigarh, he shall be admitted to interim bail to the satisfaction of the trial Court.

A copy of the receipt depositing the aforesaid cost of Rs.25,000/- as well as a copy of the order granting interim bail to the petitioner be produced in the Court on the next date of hearing.

Thereafter, on 25.09.2023, the following order was passed:-

“The prayer in the application under Section 482 Cr.PC is for extending the time granted by this Court for a period of two weeks.

Heard.

For the reasons stated in the application, the same is allowed and the petitioner is granted two weeks more time from today to comply with the order dated 14.09.2023 passed by this Court.

The application stands disposed of.

Thereafter, on 13.10.2023, the following order was passed:-

“The present application has been filed by the applicant/petitioner to extend the time granted by this Court vide orders 14.09.2023 and 25.09.2023 for a period of two weeks.

Heard.

For the reasons mentioned in the application, the same is allowed and one week's time is granted to the applicant/petitioner to comply with the orders dated 14.09.2023 and 25.09.2023.

CRM stands disposed of. “

In terms of the aforementioned orders, the petitioner has surrendered and has since been released on bail vide orders dated

17.10.2023/18.10.2023. The copy of the said orders are marked as A & B. He has also deposited a sum of Rs.25,000/-.

In view of the above, no further orders are required to be passed by this Court.

It is expected that the petitioner shall not absent himself from Trial without sufficient cause.
