The present petition has been filed under Section 482 Cr.P.C. for quashing of FIR No.652 dated 25.11.2015 registered under Sections 323, 34, 356 and 506 IPC at Police Station Rohtak City, Rohtak and all proceedings arising therefrom qua the petitioners on the basis of a compromise (Annexure P-2) entered into between the parties.

On 16.11.2022 this Court had directed the parties to appear before the Duty Magistrate/Illaqa Magistrate/Trial Court for recording of their respective statements with regard to the compromise, who in turn was directed to submit a report along with the recorded statements with regard to the number of persons arrayed as accused; whether any of them is proclaimed offender; whether the compromise is genuine, voluntary and without any coercion or undue influence and as to how many victims/complainants are there in the FIR.

As directed, report dated 15.12.2022 from the Chief Judicial Magistrate, Rohtak has been received as per which the parties had recorded their statements before the Trial Court in terms of the compromise arrived at between them; only the petitioners are arrayed as accused; they have not been declared proclaimed offender(s); the compromise is valid, genuine and voluntary and that respondent No.2 is the complainant.

Learned State counsel has no objection if the present petition is allowed.

In view of the above, continuation of the proceedings in pursuance of the afore-referred FIR in which offences are not heinous as also the matter having been compromised, would be an abuse of the process of law and in terms of the law laid down by the Supreme Court in *Narinder Singh vs State of Punjab* (2014) 6 SCC 466, this Court deems it just and proper to allow the petition and resultantly quash FIR No.652 dated 25.11.2015 registered under Sections 323, 34, 356 and 506 IPC at Police Station Rohtak City, Rohtak and all proceedings arising therefrom qua the petitioners.
