allowed and Annexure P-8 is taken on record.

On 11.10.2023, the following order was passed:-

“The Prayer in this petition under Section 482 Cr.PC is for the quashing of the proclamation order passed under Section 82 Cr.PC dated 01.10.2022 (Annexure P-1) and the impugned order dated 11.11.2022 (Annexure P-2) whereby the petitioner has been declared a proclaimed persons in case FIR No.23 dated 6.4.2020 (Annexure P-2/A) under Sections 188, 269 IPC and (Section 270 IPC added later on) and Section 51 of the Disaster Management Act, 2005 and Section 3 of the Epidemic Diseases Act, 1897 registered at P.S. City Banga, District SBS Nagar.

The Counsel for the petitioner while relying on the zimni orders reproduced in the petition contends

that no proper service was ever effected upon the petitioner. He states that the petitioner is ready and willing to join the proceedings once again.

Notice of motion for 07.12.2023.

In the meanwhile, the operation of the impugned orders dated 01.10.2022 (Annexure P-1) and 11.11.2022 (Annexure P-2) shall remain stayed and the petitioner is directed to surrender before the Trial Court within a period of one week from today and subject to a deposit of Rs.25,000/- as costs with the Senior Citizen Home, Udyog Path, Sectotr 15- D, Chandigarh, he shall be admitted to interim bail to the satisfaction of the Trial Court.

The petitioner is further directed to place on record the photocopy of receipt of payment as well as the order passed by the court below granting interim bail to the petitioner.”

In terms of the aforementioned order, the petitioner surrendered and was granted interim bail. Thereafter, he has been convicted and sentenced to pay a fine of Rs.6400/-.

In view of the above, no further orders are required to be passed by this Court.
