Prayer in the present writ petition filed under Article 226/227 of the Constitution of India is for seeking directions against respondents to ensure that the respondent No.3-Deep Hospital complies with the all applicable building norms, rules and regulations.

2. A perusal of the writ petition goes on to show that the petitioner has alleged that it is a registered Society under the Societies Registration Act, 1860. However, no such document has been appended in support of the said averments. A mere resolution in favour of one Amarjit Singh Tikka who is the authorized signatory of the Society has been appended. *Prima facie* a bare reading of the petition would go on to show that there is no specific averment as to what violations have been made by respondent No.3 for which the relief is sought. The general averments pertaining to alleged traffic jams, building violations, violations under the Indian Medical Council (Professional Conduct, Etiquette and Ethics) Regulation, 2002 and regarding the ethics of medical practitioner have been made.

3. We are of the considered opinion that on the basis of such vague averments, the respondents are not liable to be put to notice and it is not a fit case to exercise our extra-ordinary writ jurisdiction under Article 226 of the Constitution of India.
4. Faced with this situation, counsel does not wish to press the present writ petition.
5. Dismissed as withdrawn.
