DEEPAK GUPTA, J.

The petitioner is seeking regular bail by way of this petition under Section 439 Cr.P.C in case FIR No.59 dated 05.04.2022 registered under Section 22(C) 29/61/85 of NDPS Act, 1985 at Police Station Sadar Faridkot, District Faridkot.

It is contended by learned counsel for the petitioner that allegations against petitioner are that 150 strips each containing 10 intoxicant tablets i.e. total 1500 intoxicant tablets of Tramadol Hydrochloride were recovered from the conscious possession of one Lakhveer Singh @ Lakha on 05.04.2022 which were taken into possession after making compliance of necessary provisions of law. In the disclosure statement, said Lakhveer Singh @ Lakha nominated the petitioner on which basis Section 29 of the NDPS Act was added.

It is conceded by learned State counsel that no recovery has been effected from the petitioner and except for the disclosure statement of the co-accused, there is no other incriminating evidence against him.

As per the custody certificate placed on record by learned State counsel, petitioner is in custody for 10 months 16 days with no criminal antecedents.

Having regard to the aforesaid facts and circumstances but without commenting anything further on the merits of the case, petitioner is admitted to bail on his furnishing bail bonds/sureties to the satisfaction of the concerned Chief Judicial Magistrate/Duty Magistrate.
