1. Instant petition has been filed under Section 439 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 seeking grant of post-arrest bail in:-

FIR No.	Dated	Police Station	Sections
20	10.02.2023	Dasuya, District Hoshiarpur	21 of the NDPS Act (Section 29 of the NDPS Act was added later on)

2. Custody Certificate dated 28.11.2023 has been filed by the State, which is taken on record.

3. Upon instructions received from ASI, Jagga Ram, State counsel submits that on the basis of secret information, residential house of Gurpreet Singh @ Bunty was raided. Although, Gurpreet Singh @ Bunty managed to escape by scaling the boundary wall, his wife, Jasveer Kaur, present petitioner, was apprehended. She was carrying a bag, which on search was found to contain 265 grams heroin and drug money of Rs.2.70 lacs. State counsel submits that the main accused has been apprehended and he is involved in some other criminal cases, although the antecedents of the petitioner are clean. He submits that charge has been framed, though no prosecution witness has been examined. He has opposed the petition by making a reference to Section 37 of the NDPS Act.

4. At this stage, counsel for the petitioner seeks and is granted permission to withdraw the petition.

5. Dismissed as withdrawn.
