JAGMOHAN BANSAL, J. (Oral)

1. The petitioner through instant petition under Article 226 of the Constitution of India is seeking direction to the respondents to re-issue her passport after correcting her date of birth and residential address.
2. The petitioner was issued passport which is valid till 06.05.2028. The petitioner has got married, thus, there is change in her residential address. The petitioner has further realized that her date of birth recorded in the passport is incorrect. The actual date of birth of the petitioner is 09.09.1999 whereas in the passport it recorded as 05.01.1997. The petitioner has furnished her matriculation certificate indicating her correct date of birth.
3. Learned counsel for the respondents submits that she has instructions to the effect that petitioner may be directed to deposit/furnish her original matriculation certificate and competent authority after verifying

veracity of the document would process application of the petitioner within 6 weeks from the date of depositing/furnishing of matriculation certificate.

4. Learned counsel for the petitioner agrees to the aforesaid arrangement.

5. In the wake of statements of both sides, the present petition stands disposed of.
