1. The present petition has been filed under Section 482 for Code of Criminal Procedure, for issuance of directions to respondent No.2 to take appropriate legal action against respondent Nos.3 & 4, who are conducting an illegal enquiry and are acting as recovery agents of respondent Nos.5 & 6 with a further prayer to issue direction to respondent Nos.2 to 4 not to harass or threaten the petitioner.

2. Learned counsel for the petitioner submitted that there is a financial dispute between the petitioner and the Municipal Corporation, Amritsar with regard to some money pertaining to parking allotment and the police had called the petitioner for recovering the aforesaid amount on behalf of the Municipal Corporation and further submitted that police could not have called the petitioner in the police station in this regard. He also submitted that a representation (Annexure P-6) was also given to the Commissioner of Police, Amritsar but no action has been taken in this regard.

3. I have heard the learned counsel for the petitioner.

4. The only grievance of the petitioner is that he has been called by the police for the purpose of recovery of money. However, a perusal of the entire petition and the representation as referred to by the learned counsel for the petitioner vide Annexure P-6 would show that neither any date nor any time has been mentioned as to when he was called to the police station in this regard. Rather the entire pleadings in the petition and in the representation are totally vague and evasive. The petitioner is seeking to invoke the provision of Section 482 of the Code of Criminal Procedure and this Court is satisfied that on the face of it, there is no reason to issue any direction to any police authorities on the basis of vague submissions made by the petitioner in the petition as well as in the representation.

5. Consequently, finding no merit in the present petition, the same is hereby dismissed.
