On 03.10.2023, following order was passed:

“Although the prayer by the petitioner is to grant the blanket bail, but it is pointed out by learned counsel for the petitioner that he is seeking anticipatory bail for a specific matter, inasmuch as DSP Homicide and Forensic, Patiala had recommended to lodge FIR against him and his son under Sections 420 and 406 of IPC, at Police Station Tripuri, District Patiala on the complaint (Annexure P-1). The report of the DSP is Annexure P-2.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contend that the petitioner has already approached to the SSP concerned for reinvestigation of the matter.

Notice of motion.

Mr. Parneet Singh Pandher, AAG, Punjab accepts notice on behalf of respondent No.1-State. Copy of paper book be supplied to him during the course of the day.

Let status report be filed on 15.11.2023. Till the next date of hearing, arrest of the petitioner is stayed.”

Status report by way of an affidavit of Shri Jaswinder Singh Tiwana, PPS, Deputy Superintendent of Police City-II, Patiala has been filed on behalf of respondent- State, as per which FIR No.369 dated 05.11.2023 under Section 420, 120-B of the IPC has already been registered against the petitioner at Police Station Tripuri, Patiala.

Learned counsel for the petitioner has made a statement so as to withdraw this petition with liberty to file fresh petition by mentioning the later developments by specifying the FIR registered against him and further prays to grant him protection for one week.

In view of the above, the instant petition is disposed of with liberty to the petitioner to file fresh petition on the same grounds by specifying the FIR registered against him.

Petitioner shall not be arrested till next week i.e. 23.11.2023, so that he can avail the remedy of filing separate petition.
