The instant petition has been instituted under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India, 1950 seeking issuance of a writ in the nature of Mandamus directing the respondents to make the payment of Rs. 20,050/- qua the works executed by the petitioner alongwith interest @ 12% per annum.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that the petitioner had executed various works assigned to him from time to time and there has never been any complaint against the works executed by the petitioner. On 09.06.2020, the work of Providing Laying DBOE Paving in various streets of Star Colony in Ward No.6 and various streets of Ward No.6, Moga was allotted to the petitioner vide work order No. 69 dated 09.06.2020. The estimate cost of this work was Rs. 20.05 lacs and the petitioner was allotted this work @ 1.10% below the estimate cost as such the tender amount comes

to be almost Rs. 19,82,945/-. After negotiation with respondent-department, the OAS was reduced @ 1.20% below the estimate amount and thereafter the tender was allotted to the petitioner @ Rs. 19,80,940/-. It is pertinent to mention here that an amount of Rs. 20,050/- was deposited as earnest money at the time of filling up the tenders on 23.12.2019. The petitioner has completed the above mentioned work within stipulated time period and the payment qua this work have also been released to the petitioner whereas, an amount of Rs. 20,050/- payable towards the respondent department as earnest money deposited is not being released to the petitioner despite several requests. The petitioner approached the respondents for a number of times, but nothing fruitful could be fetched. Thereafter, the petitioner submitted numerous representations including latest representation dated 11.05.2023 (Annexure P-3) upon respondent-authorities but the respondents neither responded to the same nor did they make the payment of outstanding amount to the petitioner.

Notice of motion.

Ms. Niharika Sharma, AAG, Punjab appears and accepts notice on behalf of respondents No.1.

Mr. Saurav Verma, who is the Additional Advocate General Punjab and would thus be on the panel of all statutory Board and Corporations of the State of Punjab has been requested to accept notice on behalf of the respondents No.2 to 4-Municipal Corporation, Moga.

On the asking of the Court, he accepts notice on behalf of respondents No.2 to 4-Municipal Corporation, Moga.

Learned counsel for the petitioner, however, submits that at this juncture, he would be satisfied if respondent No.4-Corporation Engineer,

Municipal Corporation, Moga is directed to consider and decide the representation dated 11.05.2023 (Annexure P-3) in a time bound manner.

Learned counsel for the respondents does not oppose to the prayer made by learned counsel for the petitioner.

Accordingly, in view of the above, with the consent of the parties and without commenting anything on the merits of the case, the present petition is disposed of while directing respondent No.4-Corporation Engineer, Municipal Corporation, Moga to consider and decide the representation dated 11.05.2023 (Annexure P-3) by passing a reasoned and speaking order after affording an opportunity of hearing to the respective parties within a period of three months from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order.

Needless to mention that upon considering the said representation, if any amount is found due and payable to the petitioner, the same shall be disbursed in his favour within a further period of three months.

Petition stands disposed of accordingly.
