1. On 10.10.2023, the following order was passed by this Court:-

“Prayer in this petition filed under Section 438 Cr.P.C. is for grant of anticipatory bail in case FIR No.124, dated 02.09.2023, under Sections 22 and 29 of the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act, 1985, registered at Police Station Kot Ise Khan, District Moga.

As per allegations, 70 loose intoxicated tablets were recovered from the possession of Gurdev Singh @ Debu on 02.09.2023, who in his disclosure statement nominated the petitioner to be the supplier.

Counsel for the petitioner submits that the petitioner has been falsely implicated; that no recovery was effected from the petitioner nor he was present at the spot at the time of recovery and that he is being involved on the basis of disclosure statement, which is inadmissible. It is further contended that the petitioner is ready to join the investigation.

Notice of motion.

Mr. R.S. Khaira, DAG, Punjab accepts notice on behalf of the

respondent-State. A copy of paper book be supplied to him during the course of day.

Adjourned to 07.12.2023 for filing status report.

In the meantime, petitioner is directed to join investigation and co-operate in the same. He will not leave the country without prior permission of the Court nor shall make any attempt to contact the complainant of the case or any witness associated with the case. In the event of the arrest of the petitioner, he shall be released on interim bail on his furnishing personal/surety bonds to the satisfaction of the Arresting Officer/Investigating Officer. He shall also abide by conditions as envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.”

2. Today, on instructions from ASI Jaswinder Singh, learned State counsel has informed this Court that the petitioner has joined the investigation, in compliance of the order dated 10.10.2023 and is no longer required for further investigation.

3. In view of the aforesaid, the order dated 10.10.2023 whereby the petitioner was granted interim anticipatory bail, is hereby made absolute.

4. However, she shall continue to join investigation, if and so required by the Investigating Officer.

5. Disposed of.
