[1] Prayer in the present Criminal Writ Petition under 226/227 of the Constitution of India is for issuance of directions to the Senior Superintendent of Police, Fatehgarh Sahib (respondent No. 2) to protect the life and liberty of the petitioner and her family members from the hands of private respondents No. 4 and 5 and for taking action on the complaints/representations dated 21.06.2023 and 11.10.2023 (Annexure P-3 and P-4, respectively).

[2] Learned counsel for the petitioner *inter alia* contends that due to a matrimonial dispute, the marriage of the petitioner with Vishal Tandon, son of Ashok Kumar Tandon was dissolved and thereafter, petitioner was residing in her parental house. The private respondent No. 4 (Ramanjit Singh) took advantage of the situation of the petitioner and gave a false promise of marriage. Respondent No. 4 started having physical relationship with the petitioner on the false pretext of marriage and also

purchased a House No. 82, Sector 1-B, Vikas Nagar, Mandi Gobindgarh, Fatehgarh Sahib, where both the parties started living together. A child was also born out of the said relationship and on the Birth Certificate dated 26.02.2019 (Annexure P-1), issued by the Registrar Births and Deaths, Punjab, the name of respondent No. 4 (Ramanjit Singh) is recorded as the father of the said child. Similar is the parent age recorded on the Aadhar Card of the child (Annexure P-2).

[3] The counsel for the petitioner contends that no action has been taken by the official respondents on the representations dated 21.06.2023 and 11.10.2023 (Annexures P-3 and P-4, respectively), moved by the petitioner

[4] Notice of motion.

[5] Having received advance copy of the petition, Mr. Sarabjit Singh Cheema, D.A.G., Punjab, appears and accepts notice on behalf of the official respondents No. 1 to 3. Keeping in view the innocuous prayer made, this Court is of the opinion that there is no need to seek written response from the respondents.

[6] In view of the facts and circumstances of the matter, the present petition is disposed of with a direction to the Senior Superintendent of Police, Fatehgarh Sahib, (respondent No. 2), to decide the aforesaid representations dated 21.06.2023 and 11.10.2023 (Annexures P-3 and P-4, respectively) within a period of two months from the date of the receipt of a certified copy of this order.

[7] Pending miscellaneous application (s), if any, shall also stand disposed of.
