The petitioner has filed this petition under Section 439 of Cr.P.C. for grant of regular bail in case FIR No.110 dated 11.09.2020, registered under Section 380 IPC, which was deleted and Sections 379-A and 476 IPC were added in the charge sheet, at Police Station DLF-II, District Gurugram.

Reply filed on behalf of the respondent-State is already on record.

Today there is not representation on behalf of the petitioner. Even on 25.05.2023, the situation remained the same.

As per the FIR, one masked person in red T-shirt and blue jean entered in the premises of the complainant and after stealing the keys and drove away the car bearing Registration No.HR2020 T/R 7370 AL make Jeep Compass, from the complainant's maid Manju and the petitioner has been identified by said Manju.

Learned State counsel submits that out of 12 prosecution witnesses, 11 have already been examined and the petitioner is a habitual offender, as he is involved in 38 other cases also, out of which he stands convicted in 11 cases, acquitted in 06 cases.

I have heard the learned State counsel and have also gone through the paper-book.

As noticed above, the petitioner is a habitual offender and is involved in 38 other cases and has been identified by the eye-witness.

Keeping in view the criminal antecedents of the petitioner, no ground to grant the concession of regular bail to the petitioner is made out.

Dismissed.
